Dear Children, Parents and Guardians,

School car park

Now our car park is back open, please can I remind families that it is for staff use only, **at all times**; please can you let all members of the family know, that may be in the position of dropping off or collecting children from school. Thank you.

Pupil Attendance

A quick reminder that if your child is going to be absent from school, it is a legal requirement to contact school as soon as possible to explain any absences. Also, we have a number of pupils who are still arriving late, which is taking up office time as the child signs in and then is delivered to class. Please can we ask that pupils arrive on time to prevent delays at the office. We thank you for your support in this area.

Pupil Flu Nasal Spray

The pupils are due to be given their flu nasal spray on Friday 6th October. Details will follow in a separate email from the office, together with the link that parents need to follow to give permission if they wish their child to receive this innoculation.

Bags

Since the pandemic we have asked that items brought into school are limited. This is more important now due to space available - please only allow your child to bring a small bag to school, if necessary. We have limited space in the building, and bags take up a lot of space in the classroom (no large rucksacks are allowed).

Macmillan Coffee Morning

This year our Macmillan Coffee Morning will be held on the **Friday 29th September**. To ensure we can keep our audience comfortable and we keep to fire regulations, we are splitting our morning into two sessions, one for our Lower Key Stage 2 (Yr 3 & 4) and Upper Key Stage 2 parents (Yr 5 & 6) **9:15-9:45am**, and one for EY and KS1 parents **10:00-10:30am**. If you have children in both performances, you are welcome to stay all morning; by splitting into two performances, there will be some parents who can leave early/join later, keeping numbers in the audience manageable. We will be asking for donations of cakes (bought only please) to be brought into school on the 28th September. Please can we ask that you stay for the full half hour and only leave at the end of the session, so that all children in that department have a full audience!

Harvest Assembly

Our Harvest Assembly will be held on **Tuesday 17th October**; this is an assembly that we share with the **grandparents** of the children, and we celebrate how lucky we are to have food readily available in this

country. Again, this year we are very aware that many families are struggling in our locality, and therefore our donations will be shared equally with local charities and our school families from our school food bank. We will be very grateful for any donations of tinned/dry goods (not fresh food please), and will be holding a non-uniform day on the Friday 13th October, where the children wear their 'home' clothes in lieu of a tin/packet etc. Thank you for your support with our fundraising, particularly at this time.

Parent meetings

Our priority is to work with our families to provide the best learning experience for our children, and therefore we will be providing various meetings/workshops specific for your child's education this year eg: Yr 2 SATs parents information meeting etc. This information will be sent out from the class teacher/phase leader depending on the meeting/workshop.
